

COURT CASE AWARD

1. Objective

The Court Case Award recognizes a member of the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (Alberta Branch) who works in the field of Environmental Public Health (EPH) in Alberta, the Northwest Territories or Nunavut and has received their Certificate in Public Health Inspection (Canada). This award is given to a member of CIPHI (Alberta Branch) who in the preceding year has had an EPH situation proceed to the Alberta, Northwest Territories or Nunavut court system in an effort to protect and promote public health. The member dedicated time and effort from the beginning of the situation to the presentation of the case in the courts by way of meticulous documentation and providing a clear and concise brief for the courts to review.

2. Eligibility and Criteria

In order to be nominated the following criteria must be satisfied:

- The nominee must be member-in-good standing of the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (Alberta Branch).
- The nomination must be made and seconded by individuals who are members-in-good standing of the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (Alberta Branch).
- Completion of the nomination form.
- A narrative of no more than 500 words outlining the accomplishments and contributions of the nominee must be completed and attached with the nomination form.
- A photocopy of the nominee's Certificate in Public Health Inspection (Canada).

Please note that all documentation must be received by the President of the Canadian Institute of Public Health Inspectors (Alberta Branch) by December 31st.

3. Application

The Nomination Form and all supporting documentation must be submitted and postmarked no later than December 31 to:

4. General Policy

- All documentation will be reviewed by the Executive to ensure the information meets the above criteria and a decision will be made by the Branch Executive. Those executive members who have had contact with the individual and that may have a conflict of interest arising from such contact shall inform the Branch President in writing and recuse themselves from the award selection process immediately.
- Only one award recipient will be chosen by the Executive each calendar year.
- The recipient's name may be posted on the Alberta Branch Website and printed in the Alberta Branch Newsletter informing the membership.
- The Executive of the CIPHI (Alberta Branch) will review, assess, and modify this award as necessary to reflect the philosophy and best interests of the Association and its' membership.
